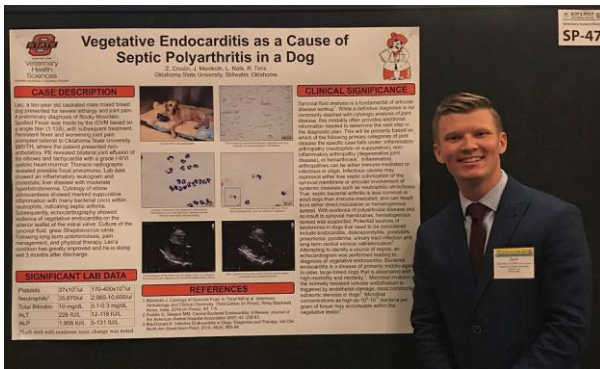




Pathology Rules

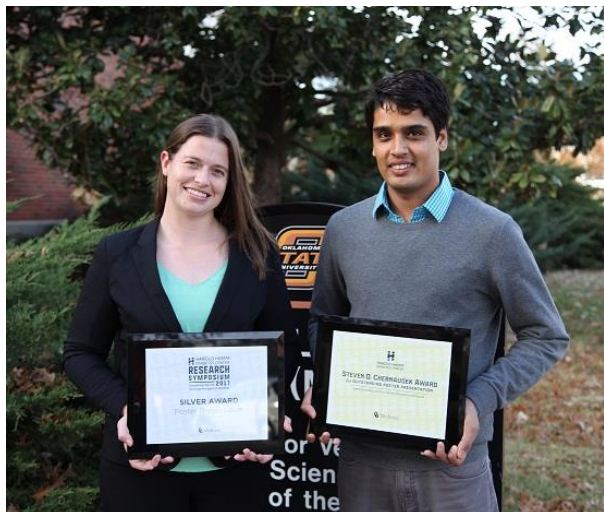
