An international audience representing 10 different countries attended the conference, which was held at a remote ski lodge high in the Austrian Alps.

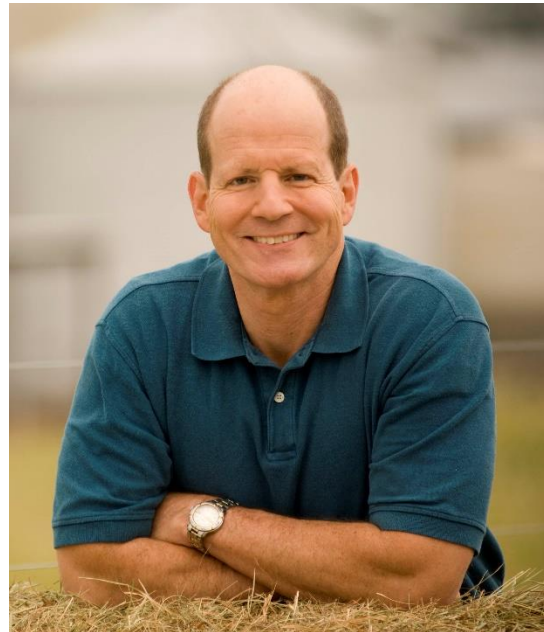
Fulton presented an abstract entitled, "Effect of hyperthermia on mitochondrial function in canine skeletal muscle."
