Consists of six members, five licensed veterinarians and one lay person.


Appointed by the Governor for 5 year terms and confirmed by the Senate.

New Compounding Rules

In response to the FDA Guidance documents – the Board of Pharmacy have new rules for Non-Sterile and Sterile compounded drugs. Compounding with bulk chemicals for food producing animals **is not** permitted.

Compounding veterinarian preparations

Allows a veterinarian to dispense or transfer compounded medications to the owner of an animal patient or a veterinarian in the same practice. Allows a pharmacy to compound animal drugs from bulk substances for office use without patient-specific prescriptions for nonfood-producing animals if the drug is 1) compounded under direct supervision of a pharmacist, 2) listed on the FDA's "List of Bulk Drug Substances for Compounding Office Stock Drugs for Use in Nonfood-Producing Animals", 3) all inactive ingredients and finished drug products meet applicable standards, 4) upon awareness of adverse event, the compounding pharmacist alerts the FDA in 15 days, 5) specified labelling requirements are met.

New Compounding Rules

Compounding veterinarian sterile preparations

Allows veterinarians to transfer compounded medications to the owner/caretaker of an animal patient, or veterinarian in the same practice. Removes the ability of a licensed pharmacy to compound veterinary drug products to be used by veterinarians in their office for single treatment, not to exceed 120 hour supply. Allows a pharmacy to compound animal drugs from bulk substances for office use without patient-specific prescriptions for NONFOOD-PRODUCING ANIMALS if: 1) drug is compounded by/under direct supervision of pharmacist in state-licensed pharmacy or federal facility 2) the drug is on the FDA's 'List of Bulk Drug Substances for Compounding Office Stock Drugs for Use in Nonfood-Producing Animals'. Compounding pharmacist must report any adverse event or product defect to FDA within 15 days.

New Over the Counter Antibiotic Changes

June 11, antibiotics that are currently Over the Counter (OTC) became prescription drugs (Rx). This is an attempt by FDA to cause antibiotic use in animals to be better regulated and used appropriately to prevent antibiotic resistance. This change impacts any product that contains the following:

Oxytetracycline Penicillin Sulfa-based antibiotics (sulfadimethoxine and sulfamethazine) Tylosin Cephapirin and Cephapirin Benzathine Swine medications Lincomycin and Gentamicin New Over the Counter Antibiotic Changes Coming (Con't)

Stores that currently sell these OTC products will have to become licensed through the Oklahoma Board of Pharmacy as a Wholesale Distributor. The Board of Pharmacy will require \$400, completion of the application, inspection of their facility and if they are selling veterinary prescription medications they register annually with the Oklahoma Board of Veterinary Examiners. The Wholesale Distributor annual renewal is \$200. The application is on the Pharmacy Board website and if you have any questions, please contact them. New Over the Counter Antibiotic Changes Coming (Con't)

The approved/registered wholesaler/distributor will have to have the Rx drugs in a locked area that can only be accessed by staff, so drugs like penicillin will not be allowed to be in a refrigerator with vaccine so the purchaser can pull it out and take it to the register. The Rx drugs may only be purchased with a prescription from a licensed veterinarian who has a Veterinary/Client/Patient relationship with the producer/purchaser. It is not legal, ethical, or acceptable for a veterinarian to lend their name and prescription pad to a Wholesale Distributor to make it easier for a business to sell Rx antibiotics.

List of Approved New Animal Drug Affected by GFI #263

A limited number of other dosage forms (e.g. injectables) of approved medically important antimicrobials remain available overthe-counter (OTC). All new animal drug applications https://www.fda.gov/animal-veterinary/antimicrobial-resistance/listapproved-new-animal-drug-applications-affected-gfi-263 - have been identified as medically important antimicrobial drugs that currently remain approved as over-the-counter products.

List of Approved New Animal Drug Affected by GFI #263

GFI #263 had a two-year implementation period that began June 11, 2021. To provide for a more predictable timeline for when revised (prescription) labels were expected to enter the market, the affected drug companies made plans to ensure that, after June 11, 2023, all new product entering distribution channels be labeled as prescription products. FDA intends to allow existing inventory of OTC-labeled product that may already be in distribution channels to deplete.

Veterinarian - Client - Patient Relationship

Needed for any aspect of practicing veterinary medicine other than the Good Samaritan act

Veterinarian assumed responsibility for medical judgements, client has agreed to follow instructions

Has knowledge of the animal(s)

Available for follow-up care

Essential for veterinary prescription drugs or CDS

Providing prescriptions without a valid VCPR

Be cautious if a wholesaler/distributor asks you:

- to be a "consultant"
- to sign a "blanket script"
- sign a prescription without a valid VCPR

Remember: You and the wholesaler/distributor are required to ensure there is proper labeling and you maintain the original written order on file.

NEW or RENEWING a DEA REGISTRATION

Beginning on June 27, 2023, practitioners will be required to check a box on their online DEA registration form - regardless of whether a registrant is completing their initial registration application or renewing their registration - affirming that they have completed the new eight hour training requirement on the treatment and management of patients with opioid or other substance use disorders. This DOES NOT apply to veterinarians.






Drug OD is the leading cause of accidental death in the US, with over 107,622 lethal drug overdoses 2021 all time highest drug overdose deaths, primarily synthetic Opioids,

• 107,622 equal 295 deaths per day over 12 per hour 1 life around every 5 minutes

- Opioids were responsible for nearly (72%) of all drug overdose deaths. Overdose deaths from opioids increased from 50.963 in 2019 to an estimated 69.710 in 2020 CDC-NCHS
- Fentanyl and Methamphetamine largest increases
- In 2012, 259 million prescriptions were written for opioids, which is more than enough to give every American adult their own bottle of pills.
- OD deaths rank just below diabetes in terms of highest death count
- Rate of OD deaths involving synthetic opioids increased at an annual rate of 580% over five years (2012-2017).





STATE OF OKLAHOMA- Drug Related Overdoses (OBN - Medical Examiners)



Multistate Effort Urging President Biden to Classify Fentanyl as a Weapon of Mass Destruction (Sept 15, 2022)

- "Fentanyl is cheap to produce, deadly in very small amounts, and is everywhere. This is a chemical weapon," Former OK. Attorney General O'Connor.
- "Just two milligrams of fentanyl is needed to kill an adult, and it can easily be placed in other substances.
- Based on Lab Results, 2 out of 5 seized counterfeit pills contain lethal doses
- More than 75,000 Americans died from overdose of synthetic opioids, mainly fentanyl, in the 12-month period ending in February 2022. This substance is now the number one killer of adults aged 18-45
- This action would require the Department of Homeland Security and the Drug Enforcement Administration to coordinate a response with other agencies, including the Department of Defense.
- 18 States Attorney Generals sign letter to President Biden.

Emerging Xylazine Threat:



The drug, called Xylazine, is a sedative used in veterinary medicine, and it is not approved for use in humans. Recently, the tranquilizer began popping up in the U.S. illegal drug supply, frequently in combination with Heroin and Fentanyl.

Xylazine is newly emerging in the continental US A drug of abuse in Puerto Rico since the early 2000s.

A study found that the prevalence of xylazine use among drug users sampled in the San Juan metropolitan area was 80.7%.

Philadelphia, —according to a new study, the vet tranquilizer is now implicated in 1/3 of fatal overdoses involving heroin and/or fentanyl in the city.

The study calls on jurisdictions who don't test for xylazine in toxicology reports to include it. Also pushing for more education about the drug.

- Details Xylazine is a non-opiate sedative, analgesic, and muscle relaxant only authorized in the United States for veterinary use according to the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. It is not currently a controlled substance under the U.S. Controlled Substances Act.
- In licit sales for veterinary use, Xylazine is available in liquid form and sold in vials or preloaded syringes. These solutions are prepared at a concentration appropriate for administration by injection based on the general size and weight of the species.
- Xylazine is also readily available for purchase on other Internet sites in liquid and powder form, often with no association to the veterinary profession nor requirements to prove legitimate need.
- At this low price, its use as an adulterant may increase the profit for illicit drug traffickers, as its psychoactive effects allows them to reduce the amount of fentanyl or heroin used in a mixture.
- It may also attract customers looking for a longer high since xylazine is described as having many of the same effects for users as opioids, but with a longer-lasting effect than fentanyl alone

TUSI – "Pink Cocaine"

According to the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), pink cocaine can refer to cocaine that has been dyed pink called TUSI

- pink cocaine is a synthetic drug made from phenylethylamine and mixed with other drugs produce psychoactive effects.
- It is not derived from the coca plant like traditional cocaine





- TUSI is a pink powdery substance that usually contains a mixture of Ketamine, tramadol and caffeine may or may not contain Cocaine It is a hallucinogenic drug that was developed in Colombia and is easily produced in clandestine labs.
- Very Popular in Latin America and Europe emerging in NYC night clubs

Gabapentin

- Gabapentin is an anticonvulsant prescribed by veterinarians predominantly to treat chronic pain
- In Humans Gabapentin may be prescribed, also abused for euphoria, potentiating the high from opiates, reduction of alcohol cravings, a cocaine-like high, as well as sedation or sleep.
- Individuals at the highest risk for abusing gabapentin include those with opioid abuse, mental illness, or previous history of prescription drug abuse
- States are now taking action to track gabapentin use through prescription monitoring programs, and some states have reclassified it as a Schedule V controlled substance.
- In February 2022, the nonprofit advocacy group Public Citizen filed a petition with the DEA and U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to make a Controlled substance.

Effective Controls

21 CFR § 1301.71(a)

"All applicants and registrants shall provide effective controls and procedures to quard against theft and diversion of controlled substances."

Protect Yourself, Staff and Clients

Opioids are a small part of a veterinarian's medical arsenal for controlling pain in animals, but stocking, prescribing, and administering these products also makes veterinarians vulnerable to abuse from those seeking these drugs for personal use. (FDA)

- □ Follow All State Regulations on Storing, Prescribing, Administering, Dispensing Opioids -Title 59 and OBN 475

 - . Oklahoma PMP Reporting and Mandatory PMP Checks of pet owners past medication history
 States are enacting new laws or strengthening existing ones to restrict access to opioids. PMP Reporting, Oklahoma, requires veterinarians to look at a pet owner's past medication history before dispensing opioids or writing an opioid or Benzo prescription.
- □ Follow All Federal Regulations on Prescribing, Administering, Dispensing Opioids. The Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), however, creates and enforces the regulations regarding controlled substances. When controlled substances are stolen from the clinic, veterinarians must report the theft to DEA and to their local police department as soon as possible. (DEA Form 106)
- □ Use Alternatives to Opioids
 ➤ Pain management is an important issue in veterinary medicine, and in many cases non-opioid protocols may adequately control pain in animals. The International Association of Veterinary Pain Management External Link Disclaimer is a good resource for pain management information for companion animals,

Protect Yourself, Staff and Clients -

- Educate Pet Owners on Safe Storage and Disposal of Opioids and other CDS
 Whenever pets are actively receiving opioids, you should advise pet owners to lock up the opioids and secure them out of sight or take back boxes at local Police.
- ☐ Know What to Do If a Dog Overdoses on Fentanyl or Other Opioids
 ➤ Not only can people overdose on opioids, but so can pets. Working dogs, like narcotics detection dogs, are particularly susceptible because they may inhale the powdered drug. Because fentanyl and fentanyl-related drugs are potent, it only takes a tiny amount of drug to cause an overdose. (Narcan for dogs)
- ☐ Have a Safety Plan and Know the Signs of Opioid Abuse
- In the event you encounter a situation involving opioid diversion or clients seeking opioids under the guise of treating their pets, you should have a safety plan in place. Local police departments, OBN or the Vet Board can advise you about what to do in these situations.
- Guard against Internal Employee Theft and Diversion



Popular Methods of Internal Diversion

- Theft of vials or syringes

CDS Monitoring - Recommendations



- Check OSCN, check with local law enforcement.
- Have the applicant provide a recent OSBI records check.
- Check with OBN, and the Veterinary Board about applicant.
- Checks and Balances in Place
- Drug Testing

CDS Monitoring - Recommendations



- When hiring employees and they have access to Controlled Dangerous Substances (CDS) you must do a thorough background check.
- Anyone convicted or who pled guilty for a misdemeanor or felony related to CDS must obtain a waiver from the Director of the OK Bureau of Narcotics (OBN). This waiver must be given in writing.

CDS Monitoring - Recommendations



 Consider purchasing (and using) a video camera system in the area where CDS is stored and also throughout the clinic.

CDS Registrations

- Administering, prescribing or dispensing of any CDS in Oklahoma an OBNDD registration is required.
- If ordering or prescribing of any CDS a DEA registration is also required.
- OBNDD Registration are now only valid for 1 year. (October 31) and DEA registrations are valid for a three year period, before renewing your veterinary license ensure your drug registrations are current.

Oklahoma is a *dual-registration* state...

- All DEA laws apply unless they are superseded by a more restrictive OBN rule.
- The OBN requires a registration to administer, dispense, prescribe, and order CDS. Whereas a DEA registration is only required if you order or prescribe CDS.

Maintenance of Effective Controls Against Diversion – Proper Record Keeping

Title 59 § 775:25-1-2.

(a) Each veterinarian shall maintain a legible patient record for three years, unless the records contain information with respect to the dispensation of veterinary prescription drugs, in which case the records shall be maintained for no less than five years. All patient records shall include the following necessary elements. (See Title 59 § 775:25-1-2.)

TAKE AWAYS

- Establish effective controls against Diversion Backgrounds checks, Checks and balances Xylazine Lock up and Guard against Diversion (Treat like a CDS)
- Check the PMP on owners if you are prescribing an Opioid or a Benzodiazepine (Especially new clients or clients who ask for a specific
- 3. Be cautious if owner is receiving opioids or benzos from another prescriber, assess the situation, consider on site administration of medication.
- Document, Document remember if it isn't written down it didn't happen.
- 5. Keep All Records for five (5) years. 1yr. Readily Retrievable
